Canine Vaccine Questionnaire

Required Core Vaccines:

***DHLPP**

(D) Distemper- is so widespread that nearly every dog will be exposed in its lifetime. Distemper's high death rate makes vaccination a must. Dogs with distemper may suffer coughing, vomiting, diarrhea, and other symptoms followed by death.

(H) Hepatitis- affects the dog's liver. It spreads through an infected dog's urine and exposure can result in anything from a mild infection to death.

(L) Leptospirosis- is a bacterial infection that affects a dog's kidneys. Disability or even death in severe cases is possible. These bacteria can even infect people.

(P) Parvovirus - Intestinal viral infection resulting in diarrhea, fever, vomiting, and severe depression. Transmitted through contact with an infected dog's feces, it is highly contagious and life threatening, especially in puppies.

(P) Parainfluenza - Can cause an upper respiratory infection causing a persistent, dry, hacking cough. The disease may last several weeks and is highly contagious.

***Rabies** - Is a fatal infection of the nervous system that attacks all warm blooded animals including humans. It is a public health hazard and **can be transmitted to humans**. There is no cure for rabies. Vaccination is your pet's only protection and is required by Law.

***Annual Fecal Analysis** - To screen your pet for intestinal parasites, which threaten your pet's health. In large numbers, they can cause intestinal blockages, bloody diarrhea, and even premature death. Microscopic examinations of your pet's stool should be done yearly for early detection and treatment. Some **intestinal worms can be transferred to humans**.

***Heartworm Test** - To screen your pet for heartworm disease, which is life threatening wherever mosquitoes are present. Adult dogs must be tested prior to starting on preventative medication. Use of preventatives in an infected dog could result in death. Annual testing is recommended even with year round use of medication. Preventative medication is a must.

Optional Vaccinations:

***Bordetella (TBR) - Required if staying in the hospital/ boarding/ or grooming.** Bordetella protects against Canine Kennel Cough, a very contagious upper respiratory infection that may last for several weeks.

***Lyme - Highly recommended for pets who hike/swim/camp or are in deer tick prevalent areas.** Certain tick species carry and transmit the bacteria that cause Lyme disease. Affects animals differently and in many cases starts with limping, lymph node swelling, and fever. Other signs include loss of appetite, painful joints, and lethargy. **Humans can also contract this disease from the bite of an infected tick.**

***Leptospirosis (4-way) - Highly recommended for pets who hike/swim/camp or have access to streams or bodies of water.** A bacterial infection that affects a dog's kidneys. Disability or even death in severe cases is possible. Your dog can become infected by drinking, swimming in/or walking through contaminated water. Leptospirosis is a contagious disease that can be transmitted from dog to dog. **Humans can also contract this disease.**

***Corona - Required as a core puppy vaccine.** Intestinal viral infection resulting in diarrhea, fever, vomiting, and severe depression. Highly contagious and life threatening in puppies.
